EXPOSES: How we revealed the secrets of Christina Gallagher's House of Prayer money trail

When I first walked in I nearly died as I come from a normal background.

"Christina loves showing off her things but when you ask how much they cost, she gets all coy."

Another person said: "I was embarrassed when I saw all this luxury. She has got incredibly expensive tastes but I just don't know where she gets the money. She spends it like water."

Locals on Achill Island have told us that the number of visitors at the House of Prayer have plummeted in recent weeks following our revelations.

We also told how she was driving a magnificent BMW seven series car, which start at €110,000.

On January 27, we uncovered the shocking financial dealings of the House of Prayer and how Gallagher was raking in millions of euro from devout Catholics around the country for a "secret project which would save millions of souls".

Donors were asked to write their cheques not to the House of Prayer but

to a "John Rooney". We revealed that a John Rooney had bought the magnificent mansion where Gallagher lives shortly after this nationwide fundraising campaign.

And last week, February 3, we revealed how priests and devout Catholics around the country had thanked the *Sunday World* for exposing what was going on at the House of Prayer and how they were preying on the elderly and vulnerable for cash.

Dozens of people have flooded the *Sunday World*, RTE and local radio stations with stories about ageing relatives being encouraged to hand over huge sums of money.

The House of Prayer has responded to our revelations by denying everything.

Disillusioned

They laughingly told one supporter that Gallagher used the mansion in Malahide "to escape from the paparazzi" - a ridiculous claim considering the only pictures newspapers had of Gallagher were 10 or 15 years old and nobody knew what she looked like... until we snapped her last month.

Gallagher has also been telling followers that she had a vision from "Our Blessed Mother" weeks before our reports warning her that the greatest attack ever was about to be launched against the House of Prayer and that it therefore came as no surprise.

She fails to tell them that she, in fact, discovered some of her most devoted followers were spilling the beans to the *Sunday World* after becoming disillusioned with her incredible lifestyle.
